

# HOW TO FIND WATER LEAKS

## BEFORE THEY DRAIN YOUR BUDGET!

### Water leaks can be a costly problem!

- The average household can leak as much as 10,000 gallons of water every year
- A running toilet can waste 200 gallons or more per day
- Early detection of a water leak can save you money and avert potential disaster

### Common locations for a leak to occur:

- Toilet
- Faucets
- Showerheads
- Outdoor irrigation



## 3 EASY STEPS TO IDENTIFY A WATER LEAK

### STOP

- Turn off all equipment and appliances within the property that use water

### LOOK

- Look at the red triangle on your meter
- If the triangle is moving, then water is still flowing and there is probably a leak

### CALL

- Make an appointment with a plumber to come and check the property

### LOW FLOW INDICATOR ▲

If this red triangle is still moving after everything on your property that uses water is shut off, either a device using water is still turned on, or there is a leak
